Matthew 6:19-25a (NLT)

- ¹⁹ "Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be.
- ²² "Your eye is like a lamp that provides light for your body. When your eye is healthy, your whole body is filled with light. ²³ But when your eye is unhealthy, your whole body is filled with darkness. And if the light you think you have is actually darkness, how deep that darkness is!

Ecclesiastes 5:10 (NLT)

¹⁰ Those who love money will never have enough. How meaningless to think that wealth brings true happiness!

- More SIGNIFICANCE

Luke 12:15 (NLT)

¹⁵ Then he said, "Beware! Guard against every kind of greed. Life is not measured by how much you own."

- More SECURITY

Ecclesiastes 5:11-17 (NLT)

- ¹¹ The more you have, the more people come to help you spend it. So what good is wealth—except perhaps to watch it slip through your fingers!
- ¹² People who work hard sleep well, whether they eat little or much. But the rich seldom get a good night's sleep.

¹³ There is another serious problem I have seen under the sun. Hoarding riches harms the saver. ¹⁴ Money is put into risky investments that turn sour, and everything is lost. In the end, there is nothing left to pass on to one's children. ¹⁵ We all come to the end of our lives as naked and emptyhanded as on the day we were born. We can't take our riches with us.

¹⁶ And this, too, is a very serious problem. People leave this world no better off than when they came. All their hard work is for nothing—like working for the wind. ¹⁷ Throughout their lives, they live under a cloud—frustrated, discouraged, and angry.

GOD'S WAY TO AVOID FINANCIAL TROUBLE

1. GIVE back to God first.

Proverbs 3:9-10 (NLT)

⁹ Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce.

¹⁰ Then he will fill your barns with grain, and your vats will overflow with good wine

2. SAVE for the future.

Proverbs 21:20 (NLT)

²¹ The wise have wealth and luxury, but fools spend whatever they get.

3. PLAN your spending.

Proverbs 21:5 (NLT)

⁵ Good planning and hard work lead to prosperity, but hasty shortcuts lead to poverty.

4. KEEP good records.

Proverbs 27:23-24 (NLT)

²³ Know the state of your flocks, and put your heart into caring for your herds,

for riches don't last forever, and the crown might not be passed to the next generation.

5. ENJOY what you have.

Ecclesiastes 6:9 (NLT)

⁹ Enjoy what you have rather than desiring what you don't have. Just dreaming about nice things is meaningless—like chasing the wind.

Ecclesiastes 5:19 (NLT)

¹⁹ And it is a good thing to receive wealth from God and the good health to enjoy it. To enjoy your work and accept your lot in life—this is indeed a gift from God.

Matthew 6:31-33 (NLT)

³¹ "So don't worry about these things, saying, 'What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear?' ³² These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. ³³ Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need
