⁴² All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.

GROUPS QUESTIONS:

6. Can you think of a time when you experienced real peace through belonging to a community instead of handling something alone? What happened?

7. On a scale of 1-10, how well do you feel known, accepted, supported, and developed in your current community? Which area needs the most growth?

8. What would it look like for you to take a step toward being more open or more present in your group? What's one thing you could do this week?

9. What kind of support or intentional friendship are you hoping for from your group? How can we help each other grow in that?
