- 1. What stood out to you about this week's sermon?
- 2. Read John 8:12. Jesus declares Himself the "light of the world." What does it practically look like to "walk in the light" in a world that often feels dark and chaotic?
- 3. John 9:1-3 shows Jesus redirecting blame to purpose. How does this challenge your view of suffering or difficulty in your

- life or in others'? Share a time when God used a hard season to reveal His glory in your life.
- 4. How does this truth change the way we approach pain, injustice, or confusion in our lives?
- 5. Pastor Nolan said, "There is no such thing as being "sort of" Christian." Why do you think spiritual apathy or spiritual anemia is so common today, and how can we guard against it?
- 6. Looking at the options of "Receive or Resist," where do you think most people around you fall?
- 7. What does it look like to actively receive Christ daily, not just passively believe in Him?
- 8. In John 11:4, Jesus reframes a deadly illness as an opportunity for God's glory. How can we grow in seeing life through the lens of eternity rather than just present circumstances?
- 9. What are some examples of "insanity" in today's culture that you see differently because of your faith?
- 10. How should the reality of eternity impact the way we pray, live, and share our faith? Are we living with that kind of urgency?
- 11. What gives you confidence in the truth and endurance of God's Word, even in a skeptical or hostile culture?
